**Andy** – *Brady's Civil War* by Webb Garrison (973.7 GARRISON) – In this collection of over 300 civil war photographs, the author and his assistants capture familiar iconic images such as portraits of Lincoln and Grant, as well as vivid battlefield shots.

**Barbara** – *The Devil She Knows* by Bill Loehfelm, (FIC LOEHFELM) – This is a page turner about a young woman who unwittingly stumbles on a scene that leaves her running for her life.
